Eastertide is over. What Now? What Next?

As disciples of Jesus Christ each one of us is on a spiritual journey; it matters less where we are in that journey and more that we are actually journeying. However, we should recall the command of Jesus that we be perfect (Matthew 5:48); this must surely be amongst Our Lord's hardest teachings. However, wherever we are in our spiritual journey, or indeed whatever struggles we have faced in the past, every single one of us can take a "next step" along the path that will lead us to God. In this regard the Bible offers us this simple suggestion and comfort: *"Draw near to God and he will draw near to you"* (James 4:8). Whether you have been baptised and/or Confirmed or are wanting to know God better, we invite you to take a "next step" by pondering on this day - when we are **renewed with the power of the Holy Spirit** - what spiritual endeavour will I take up during Ordinary Time? It might be to: attend a midweek Mass; celebrate the Sacrament of Confession more regularly; read a Sacred Scripture passage each day; pray Morning Prayer; offer the Holy Rosary; learn the Divine Mercy chaplet; read about the life of a saint; attend one of our two Rosary groups; etc... Whatever it is, **ask the Holy Spirit** to provide you with both the enthusiasm to embark upon this endeavour and the strength to persevere with it.

"The parish is not just a collection of individual families, but a living body. ... We may not care for every aspect of a particular parish experience: we may not like the music or the church architecture, or perhaps the homilies leave us untouched; maybe we feel isolated or out of place. But we must remember two things. First, the Eucharist is the central and unifying element that supersedes any cosmetic issues we may see. Second, we should remember that we have an integral role to play in the parish. It's vitality depends in no small measure on the vitality breathed into it by each parishioner" - **St John Paul II**. A new Feast for England and Wales, Thursday after Pentecost

The Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest, according to the order of Melchizedek. In him the Father has been well pleased from before all time. As Mediator between God and human beings, fulfilling his Father's Will, he sacrificed himself once on the altar of the Cross as a saving Victim for the whole world. Thus, instituting the pattern of an everlasting sacrifice, with a brother's kindness he chose, from among the children of Adam, men to augment the priesthood, so that, from the sacrifice continually renewed in the Church, streams of divine power might flow, whereby a new heaven and a new earth might be made, and throughout the whole universe there would be perfected what no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor has entered into the human heart. **Please pray for own priest, Fr Wayne.**



Be vigilant, be cautious.

A purse was recently stolen from HC Church whilst someone was receiving Holy Communion; we should feel secure in a Catholic Church so it is therefore unfortunate that we have to ask that people do not leave valuables unattended. SsP&J has recently been the target of a number of thefts (as have a number of local Catholic churches and other places of Christian worship) so we need to be extra cautious and vigilant.
