During the course of the day I was able to share with the executive team of Missio how some parishioners have expressed concern that my focus is taken away from parish ministry as I work on behalf of this papal charity across the Diocese. I took up the post of Diocesan Director and later new responsibilities within Missio at the invitation of Bishop Peter; however, if this is of real concern to people I will initiate a further conversation with the Bishop about this. My thanks also to those people who attended the Vigil Mass in SsP&J and particularly to our two new servers (who brought forward candles in the colours of the Missio Rosary). Over all it was a really inspiring gathering and a fantastic way of showing people from across the Diocese the warmth of welcome that awaits any visitor to our parishes. **Fr Wayne.**

Missio

Thank you to everyone who has supported the Missio wall-safe box in the narthex of SsP&J. Wondrously we have raised £128.75 which will be used to support the Society of St Peter the Apostle (SPA) component of Missio. SPA trains Priests and Religious Sisters for mission parishes in some of the world's poorest regions. Every single penny counts towards bringing the love of God to these people; e.g. £5 enables Priests and Sisters to visit the sick and imprisoned, £15 buys theological books for those preparing for the Priesthood and Religious Life, £42 helps form a seminarian for the Priesthood. Please hold the SPA in your prayers.

From the Liturgy at the First Communion Mass, these are some of the children's "Reflections on preparing to receive Holy Communion for the first time". This is the second of three.

We've got to know our church and what's inside its walls.

We've walked the Stations of the Cross, prayed with the candles and made a giant rosary.

We've listened to bible readings and understood how important the teaching is to us in our lives today.

We're no longer bored at Mass because we understand what's happening at each stage and we join in with the prayers, actions and hymns and pay more attention to what is being said.

We've grown to know Jesus more and want to be with him in the Mass.

We all feel a lot closer to God than we did before and want to talk to Him more.

We know now that prayer is not simply written words on paper but a conversation with Him and one we can have at any time and in any place.

Lots of us pray on the way to school, throughout the day and at night. We thank Him for the things He's given to support us in difficult times.

Guild of St Stephen

Bishop Peter has written to the parish to confirm that, in accord with Canon 312 of the Code of Canon Law, he gives permission for a Guild of St Stephen (for those who serve in the sanctuary) to be erected in the parish. Furthermore, Vincent Cardinal Nichols has signed the "Diploma of Affiliation" (which will be hung in the sacristy). Once the Guild Enrolment Book has arrived we shall enrol those servers who have served in the sanctuary for more than a year; each will be presented with a Guild medal; a Handbook and an Enrolment certificate. In his letter Bishop Peter says: "In this way, may the care of the Sacred Liturgy, and the faithful attendance and service of your altar servers, redound to the Glory of God and the good of all who participate in the Worship offered by the Church to God". Please pray for our altar servers that each will serve with joy and reverence within the sanctuary and at the altar.

"I love to use Alpha with young people because it takes them on a journey into the heart of God and it lays down foundations that they can build the rest of their lives upon. The easy-going 'come and see' approach is perfect for teenagers, often encouraging them to make a decision to follow Jesus, while launching them into a relationship with Him that is real and honest." *Will Desmond, Catholic Youth, UK.*

"Alpha lit a spark of faith that has grown into a fire. Hearing that Jesus would have died for me even if I were the only person in the world, melted away my objections and I began a personal relationship with God, which has been necessary for personal transformation. I am more patient, more kind, more tolerant, and especially more interested in how I can help others. Prior to Alpha, I attended Sunday Mass about 75% of the time but I was asleep in the pew. It was a duty I inherited. After Alpha, I was drawn to Mass and Confession as never before; the desire was just there. "One of the advantages of Alpha is that it focuses on the kerygma. In the ancient church there was a clear distinction between the kerygma and the Didaché, the catechesis. The kerygma was the starting point of faith, and the catechesis had to form the faith, but faith in itself blossoms only by hearing the kerygma." *Fr Raniero Cantalamessa, Preacher to the Papal Household.*
