Holy Day of Obligation – Wednesday, 15th August 2018

Wednesday marks the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and is a Holy Day of Obligation. As Catholics, we are required to attend Mass on both Sundays <u>and</u> Holy Days of Obligation (or on the preceding evenings) unless we are prevented by 'grave cause'. To assist you in fulfilling your obligation, Mass will be held on:

Tuesday, 14th August (Vigil Mass) at 7.30pm (HC) Wednesday, 15th August at 9.30am (P&J)

The Missionary Society of St. Columban This is the designated Diocesan charity for 2018

The Society is an organization working in fifteen countries with a special commitment to Asia and

Latin America. The primary aim of the Columbans is inculturation of the Gospel in cross cultural environments. They engage in Reconciliation, Dialogue and building relationships between peoples of different faiths, cultures and ideologies. Columban missionary work of evangelisation includes outreach to poor and marginalized peoples, building bridges between faiths and cultures and supporting emerging local churches. At the heart of their work is the call to help people become fully human, to help establish a world of peace with justice and care for the integrity of creation in solidarity with the poor. An appeal will be conducted by Fr. Gerry Markey SSC who has worked on Mission around the globe in the Philippines, on the Mexican border in Cuidad Juarez and latterly in Chile.

Diocesan Project - Missio and CAFOD

The Diocese of Northampton has been chosen for a project that has the full support of Bishop Peter and if successful will be rolled-out across England and Wales. This is to be a month-long targeted campaign that will focus on the complementary work of Missio (the papal charity for evengelisation and aid relief for children) and CAFOD (the Conference of Bishops charity for overseas charity work). The highlight of the month will be a visit by Archbishop John Baptist Odama of Gulu, Uganda. Archbishop Odama will talk to the clergy of our Diocese (and any lay people who are interested) about the contribution that both Missio and CAFOD have made to his Diocese. Daniel Rooke

Our seminarian, Daniel Rooke, has been admitted as a "Candidate" for Holy Orders. Candidacy is the rite whereby the Church recognises the seminarian as worthy to be ordained (in this instance) a Deacon and then a Priest. Ordinarily, this takes place towards the beginning of the six years of priestly formation; however at Oscott College one applies to be admitted as a "Candidate" at the end of the fourth year. Admission as a "Candidate" is the precise moment when the seminarian says in the presence of the Church, I am morally certain that God is calling me to be his Priest and I desire to give myself unreservedly to this mission. The Bishop speaking in persona ecclesiae (in the person of the Church) responds, I recognise signs of God's call in your life; the charisms of Jesus, the Good Shepherd and of celibacy have manifested themselves clearly in your personality and behaviour. With the help of the Holy Spirit, I and those who are in charge of your formation will further test the call of God. There are two promises that are made during the rite of admission to Candidacy: 1) "To complete preparation so that you will be prepared to assume ministry within the church" and 2) "To prepare yourselves in mind and spirit to give faithful service to Christ The Lord and His Body, The Church". These promises affirm the candidate's commitment to be formed and are the first promises he makes before Ordination. One of the visible signs of having been received as a candidate for Holy Orders is the wearing of a clerical collar.
