The Jesse Giving Tree

A huge thank you to those people who have supported this idea. A sign will display information relating to the charitable causes we are supporting this year. Advent resources, for families, are available to loan from the church. In the narthex, there



are small Jesse Giving Tree cards on the reverse of which are printed the times of Masses for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

There is a *Jesse Tree icon* for people to have a look at and pray before, situated at the book of the Church.

Donations for our two charitable causes can be left below the tree itself (before and after Mass) and also in the marked wall-safe in the narthex (whenever the Church is open). Linked with the Jesse Giving Tree, which takes the form of a stylised olive tree, and throughout Advent, the glass-topped display case (near the image of Our Lady) will contain the following items from the Holy Land: • rosary beads made from olive wood • holding crosses made from olive wood • rosary beads made from olive stones (pits) • Christmas Tree decorations made from olive wood • olive tree leaves • olive oil.

Bp Peter is backing the "Mission Together" (Missio) campaign that monies raised at a parish's Giving Tree and Christmas Crib support the work of this charity in its 175th anniversary year. Monies raised and your prayers will make a huge difference to the many children around the world who are in desperate need. Donations offered at the Giving Tree and Christmas Tree at PJ will support this appeal (and our own youth project linked to the new, forthcoming, Catholic Youth Minister); likewise, monies collected at the Christmas Crib in HC will support the work of this papal charity and our Catholic Youth Minister

Why a stylised olive tree for the Jesse Giving Tree?

The olive tree is rich in glorious symbolism within the Sacred Scriptures and features heavily in the account of human salvation. Since the Franciscans retook possession of the small olive grove adjacent to the Church of All Nations in 1681, the community have tended to eight of the oldest olive trees in the Holy Land. Tradition, backed by modern genetic testing, holds that these gnarled trees were grafted from a single tree that was a witness to Jesus' Passion and Death. In addition to the eight original trees (in the Garden of Gethsemane) they have now been joined by a tree planted by Pope Paul VI in 1964 and a sapling planted by Pope Francis. One of the Franciscans: "The oldest of trees are a testament to Jesus' suffering". Another remarked that as they pick the olives on the furthest branches on a tree so God reaches out to us however far away we are from Him. More beautifully still a connection was made to how the olives are pressed to release the oil in the similar fashion to how Jesus was crushed for us to release His Precious Blood that we receive at Mass.

ADVENT - Catholic Bishops' Liturgy Office of England and Wales:

- •Advent, as a period of expectation and preparation, is closely related to, yet distinct from, Christmas for which it prepares.
- •Advent has a twofold character. It is the season to prepare for Christmas, when Christ's first coming is remembered and is the season to direct the mind and heart to await Christ's Second Coming in judgement at the end of time.
- •Advent is a period for devout and joyful expectation. The Christian community lives in an "interim" time between two historical events: the coming of Christ in the flesh and His coming in glory at the end of time. •Popular devotions should respect the nature and character of Advent. The anticipation of Christmas should be avoided. Songs, carols and devotions which focus on the Nativity are out of place in Advent. This is to avoid compromising the season of Advent and provides an opportunity to better indicate the distinction between the Christian observance of Christmas and the secular celebrations. •Where they are the custom, the Advent Crown and the Jesse Tree help to sustain an expectant orientation and may be associated with the celebration of Mass. Prayer Vigils, Services of Light and the Sacrament of Reconciliation can be very effective in fostering a sense of watchfulness and prayer and in disposing the community to a more fruitful participation in the Masses and season of Advent.
